- A big thank you goes to those who provided musical offerings during the month of February-Bill Edington, Susie Krueger and Washington, D.C. singer-songwriter Lea Morrison, whose song "Be the Light" was inspired by the words of Amanda Gorman's Inaugural poem.
- Recently, we happened to sing two hymns with text and/or music written by Rev. Dosia Carlson, "We Yearn, O Christ for Wholeness" and "Why?" When I was researching the copyright information about her, I came upon some interesting facts about her. She died from complications from COVID-19 just two days following her 91st birthday on January 13, 2021.
- Although originally intending to become a missionary to China, she was stricken with polio during high school. She developed and administered a high school program for the orthopedically handicapped, taught college level religion and obtained her Ph.D. despite numerous hospital stays.
- Because of these experiences, she turned towards service to the most vulnerable, leading her to the Beatitudes Campus of Care in Phoenix, AZ where she served as coordinator of resident services, and Associate Minister at the Church of the Beatitudes, UCC. She was instrumental in

founding several programs that were resources for the aging.

She spent her final years residing at the Beatitudes Campus, volunteering as a director of the resident choir and developing the Center for Lifelong Learners on Campus. For those who might wish to read a complete obituary the link is included here:

Committee Discusses Reopening **Possibilities**

The Reopening Committee has been meeting through emails throughout the past year. Results have been shared with Church Council. We are a group of Church Council members, staff, and a health professional to look at when we can meet in person again. We have looked at what other churches have been doing, but I think our main information has come from general UCC recommendations and our "gut". We know how we feel and can represent our families and other congregants.

We are finally to the point where the new Covid-19 cases are dwindling, many are getting the vaccine (slowly but surely), and the weather is getting nicer. It is finally time to think about coming together in person!

Here are some ideas as to how we might do this: Have outdoor services

- With loud speakers.
- With a radio transmitter so congregants can listen on their radios (I think AM).

• Are there other outdoor possibilities? Have services indoors:

- Social distancing. Every other pew. Unused pews closed off with masking tape. Cleaning procedures after each service. No congregating indoors before or after the service.
- Should there be singing, limited singing, or no singing?
- Should plexiglass be placed between pulpit speaking or not?
