"In-vangelism"

Dear Church Family, On Saturday, April 24, 2021, the churches of the Southeast Wisconsin Association of the United

Church of Christ held our Annual Meeting. Or at least we gathered to conduct ½ of the necessary business. The second half of the meeting will be in the fall.

The meeting was held on zoom. More than 60 individuals, clergy and laity, representing the 52 churches in the Southeast Association joined on their computers and/or phones. It was good to see so many familiar faces. It seems like "forever" since we have been together.

During the meeting, our Wisconsin Conference Minister, the Rev. Franz Rigert, shared a brief greeting and his overview of the church after more than a year of pandemic. In his message, he shared a word that either I misunderstood, or he made it up to describe an important truth we need to embrace as our churches seek to reopen safely.

Franz recognized that many church members and families will not automatically return to in person worship when that opportunity happens. Many families have developed different habits in the last year and attending worship in person or serving on a mission board or bringing our children to Sunday School or youth groups is not the way their lives are being lived right now.

So, Franz suggests that instead of promoting evangelism to recruit new members we should focus on "in-vangelism" which is finding meaningful ways to reach out and invite our

current members to refocus and to return. We need each other and it will take effort to rebuild our church family and our church structure.

Does that make sense to you? It does to me. We have not had much contact for more than a year. How can we begin the process of "in-vangelism" to connect with our friends and family? What do you suggest? We are aiming to offer in person worship in a month or so. In addition to worship, what other steps do you think we need to take? Let's work on this together. We need each other. We care for one another. This is vital for the future of our congregation.

This hymn was written for the opening service and dedication of Riverside Church, New York City, which he served for twenty years."

This church is considered an interdenominational church, affiliated both with the American Baptist and United Church of Christ. It was originally conceived by both Fosdick (a Presbyterian minister) and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. (a Baptist). Fosdick's vision was to create an "interdenominational, interracial, and international church" and is know for its global and national activism. The congregation includes members of more than forty ethnic groups.
