The testimonies of these ministries proclaim the truth of God's power to transform cultures of hate and violence into communities of healing and reconciliation. They give witness to God's continuing testament and how the gifts of God are being liberated for service in the world.

Our church became an ONA congregation in 2014. This means we joyfully and faithfully welcome LGBT people into the full life and leadership of our community. In the years since we've joined in the struggle for civil rights, blessed many couples, celebrated the 2015 ruling for same-sex marriage rights. We continue to work for the full inclusion of people regardless of sexual orientation and gender expression.

I hope and pray that when you join us in a time of worship, prayer, joyful sharing and affirmation of who we are as children of God and disciples of Jesus that you and everyone else will know without a whisper of doubt that YOU are beloved and affirmed as a child of God and a devoted disciple of Jesus.

Conferences in the UCC work to support leaders, connect congregations, engage youth and young adults, and to imagine together a just world for all. And the Strengthen the Church offering makes this revitalizing work possible.

Strengthen the Church Offering Funds to coach and teach a congregation how to manage conflict and disagreement proactively. People learned how to speak up against bullying and how to lead effectively. The congregation regained a positive approach to ministry and mission. Strengthen the Church Funds helped train coaches like the Rev. Dr. Jo Marchetto and the Rev. Heather Kurtz for this conflict intervention (pictured below). Because of your gifts to Strengthen the Church, the coaches will be ready to help the next congregation struggling with conflict. Benefits upon benefit from our partnerships.

The Strengthen the Church Offering helped us wonder what new ministry God calls our congregations. Nine urban churches in Allentown, PA, participated in a Feasibility Study, partly funded by Strengthen the Church. This study checked the demographics, membership, location of members, financial supports, and mutual ministry opportunities for 5 of those conversations called for ideas for shared ministry, community outreach, mission, and building repurposing

recommendations. Because of your gifts to Strengthen the Church, these congregations embraced new ministries offered in new ways withnewleadership and new energy. Trulya strengthening moment.

#### Partnering for Mission and Giving

Jennifer Rhodes (volunteer for the Watertown Bread Basket Food Pantry) and Jennifer Bakke (board member on behalf of 1<sup>st</sup> Congregational UCC for the Watertown Food Pantry) are developing a plan to re-engage member giving of food items starting in July 2022.

Their primary focus during April & May has been discussing the similarities and differences of the two food pantries and how to coordinate giving to both food pantries by identifying items both pantries can use and then seeking monthly donations that will be equally divided between the two pantries.

They intend to develop a 12-month calendar with a few specific items to donate per month. For example:

July: Boxed pancake mix and/or syrup

August: Boxed cake and/or brownie mixes

<u>September</u>: Spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles

October: Boxed mashed potatoes and/or macaroni & cheese.

Jennifer and Jennifer are also envisioning ways to incorporate other targeted giving including Christmas in July, Support Our Students in August, Undies Sunday in September, diapers for Mary's Room in October, etc.

Watch the Chimes Newsletters , notes in the weekly bulletin and occasional in-person announcements before the Sunday service. They hope to get the communication ball rolling and keep it rolling.
