From the Pastor's Desk

I think it's finally time to share here a brief overview of the gleanings learned during the **Cottage Meetings**. What follows is a listing of each of the questions that I asked and a summary of the most common responses.

1. Reflecting on your entire experience at First Congregational United Church of Christ, remember a time when you felt the most engaged, alive, and motivated. Who was involved? What did you do? How did it feel? What happened?

Engagement was particularly high during the ONA discernment and while creating the Covenant statement in addition to theater and music, (musicals, children's choir, and praise band).

2. What are the most important contributions this congregation has made to your life? Tell me what happened. Who made a difference? How did it affect you?

The top of the list here centered on loving acceptance and community. People spoke of connecting with God and one another.

3. Don't be humble; this is important information: What are the most valuable ways you contribute to your church – your personality, your perspectives, your skills, your activities, your character? Give some examples.

It's no surprise that people spoke of their involvement in various leadership positions and the unique perspectives they were able share.

4. When have you known the most significant spiritual growth for yourself and the church? When where you growing as a disciple? Think about lessons regarding beliefs or steps of faith. Tell me what happened. What made a difference? Who was most helpful?

At every Cottage Meeting one occasion was listed as an instigator of significant spiritual growth. It was when Becca and Cami, two married women, had their son Brody baptized by Pastor Steve Savides. Not everyone supported the baptism. Those in leadership at the time, and the years since, noted that the conflict that followed was a time of spiritual growth for them and the congregation. Brody's baptism was a catalyst toward the congregation eventually becoming Open and Affirming to all persons regardless of gender identity or orientation.

- 5. What are the essential characteristics or ways of life that make this congregation unique?
 - The genuine welcome people experience when they come here. Worship participation is not the end, it is a launchpad into ministry in the world.
- 6. Make three hopes for the future of this congregation. Describe what First Congregational would look like as these hopes came true?

There was consensus around a tangible sense of moving forward, revitalized programs, increased member involvement, and expanded membership to make a greater impact in Watertown and beyond.

How would you respond to these questions?

Let's keep the conversation going.


Renewal of Baptism Vows
