As April comes upon us this year, the events of Holy Week immediately stare us in the face. Since even before the gospels were written thousands of years ago, the Holy Week narrative has served as the central piece of Jesus’ story as it’s come down to us.

It’s important to know that Holy Week is not simply one triumphalist Sunday (Palm Sunday) to another (Easter)--much stuff happens in between! From the arrival at Jerusalem of Jesus and the disciples to start the week; on through a Passover celebration of liberation followed by betrayal, arrest, torture, and execution; all the way to a proclamation of Resurrection--Holy Week likely serves as the most extreme roller coaster narrative of any time on the liturgical calendar.

As Jesus’ disciples today, these stories remain essential to us. And so, it remains important to remember them together as a community. At First Congregational UCC this year, we are offering several opportunities to do just that:

- Palm Sunday worship, April 2, 10 a.m.
(No communion served.)
- Maundy Thursday Tenebrae with Holy Communion,
April 6, 7 p.m.
- Good Friday “Stations of the Cross,” April 7, 3 p.m.
- Easter Sunday worship with Holy Communion,
April 9, 10 a.m.
(Easter breakfast to be served beforehand.)

Come, join in the re-telling of the old, old story as we reflect together as a community what it means for our discipleship today. As always, all are welcome, and Christ’s Table on Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday will be open to all.

Gingerbread Hopes to Expand Program Offerings

There will be a congregational vote April 30 concerning modifications to the church building to accommodate younger children at the Gingerbread Preschool and Childcare Center. This vote will take place at the end of the service.

There has been a Gingerbread Study Team which has hopes of expanding the Gingerbread Preschool and Childcare Center to include children younger than 30 months. Basically, this includes uniting classrooms (taking down walls), adding sinks and exterior doors, and installing a fire wall and door. Changes must be made in the building structure, per state mandates, to include infants, one-year and two-year olds. These changes will not affect the availability nor the use of rooms for Sunday School or other church purposes. Costs will be met through grants, personal donations, and appropriate church funds. It will not be a church capital campaign.

The Gingerbread Study Team will give an informational meeting at the end of the service on April 16. This will give congregants a complete idea of changes and costs. Please attend if you can. A short summary of the project will be given before the vote on April 30.

COVID and lack of childcare workers has decreased the opportunities in the Watertown area for parents and guardians to find a welcoming institution to care for their young children. With the proposed modifications, Gingerbread will be able to provide this service.

Our church has been affiliated with Gingerbread since its founding, when six of our members created Gingerbread as a new mission project within the church. This is its 57th year! The preschool and child care center has maintained a very good reputation in serving the community.

Again, please pay attention for opportunities to learn the details of the project before the April 30 vote.

Another is just north of that, the entrance to the Memorial Gardens. From there the walkway skirts the "Crane" bed and proceeds to the Susan McNaughton Memorial Fountain and then to the Gazebo and prairie. West of the Narthex is the Ruth Christensen Memorial Patio.

In May and June, close to 100 plants are put in along with new soil, fertilizer and mulch. This year stonework needs repair/replacement as well. All this brings to life these beautiful garden plots.

If you are a gardener, your time will be well spent helping with this project. If you love flowers, your time will be well spent sitting there, lost in thought, enjoying their beauty.

Uploading, editing, and converting to DVD is being done with some enhancements. Print information such as hymn lyrics, bulletin outline, scripture readings, music information, and responses are added before uploading to Vimeo, but I do this at my home and then get the link out to the cable station and church office, and finally create a DVD that is shared with Marquardt Health Center before coming back to be filed in the church archives.
