## From the Pastor's Desk

I love fall. Without a doubt, it is my favorite season. I love the coming change in temperature, I love the change in leaf colors, I love the change in seasonal activities.

But it's not just the natural

cycle of seasonal change I love; it's also the change that happens in our communities. Our routines change. We return from however we spent the summer–whether physically or mentally. School starts up again.

- And that also means that the program year gets going again at church. Sunday school returns. Another year of Confirmation programming begins. And we'll soon see the choir singing again in worship.
- There's a certain excitement with this kind of newness, though I've never quite been able to put my finger on why. Perhaps it's some leftover emotion from starting new school years as a child. But, maybe, it's something else.

- Such newness, if nothing else, offers opportunity. If you've been waiting to come back to church, if you've been thinking about checking it out again, if you've been meaning to get more involved at church, then the beginning of this new season is a perfect time. We'd love to see you so we can travel this new journey together.

What is the "Neighbors in Need" special mission offering?
