From the Pastor's Desk



December is here, and Advent has come upon us yet again. Undoubtedly, our thoughts have begun racing toward the gifts we have yet to buy, the decorations we have yet to put up, and the social

engagements we have yet to attend. Simply getting everything on the schedule can create an overwhelming sense of fatigue even before any of the activities get started.

- No matter how much effort we put into getting the calendar right, we cannot capture the meaning that lies behind this season. In the traditional gospel accounts, we are reminded that the birth of the Christ child—the entrance into the world of Emmanuel, "God with us"—is unscheduled and comes as a surprise. One might even say it's inconvenient.
- The beginning of the new church liturgical year signals a shift in the primary gospel from which we'll be hearing for the next twelve months. Mark—considered to be the earliest of the four gospels found in the Bible—provides most of the gospel texts for the coming year.
- To concentrate on the narrative of Mark's Gospel in this time of year creates some interesting dynamics. Why? Because Mark doesn't

include any Christmas story! Instead, Mark's version jumps immediately to the adult personalities of John the baptizer and Jesus of Nazareth with their radical and unsettling proclamations of the kingdom of God coming near, and the conflict that means for the earthly powers-that-be.

Although there's no manger, there are no shepherds, there's no star, nor are there *magi*, the message remains strikingly similar at the beginning of the Gospel of Mark. God and God's reign suddenly enter into our world and demand decision—the same ole' status quo or radical transformation—all in the promise that God takes on human flesh.

How will we respond this Advent and Christmas? The choice always remains ours.
