From the Pastor's Desk



As we move into February, perhaps we're used to expecting our calendars to feature groundhogs, hearts, and presidents. But, this year's a bit different—and not due to just an extra day at the end of the month. Instead of roses and candies

on February 14, at church we'll be sharing ashes.

Ash Wednesday falls on the same day as Valentine's Day this year, which invites some reflection this Lent on what Christ's passion really means, as well as what a discipleship based on the "Great Commandment" (to love God and to love neighbor) looks like. To help us focus this season, we'll be offering midweek Wednesday evening worship opportunities, in addition to Ash Wednesday. Each of these services will begin at 7 p.m. On each of the Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday, our gathering will last approximately thirty minutes. (There will be no Wednesday evening service during Holy Week.)

During our time together on Wednesday evenings, we will sing a few hymns, pray, read some scripture from the Gospel of Mark (the featured gospel in this year of the lectionary cycle), and hear of the day-by-day events of the last week of Jesus' earthly life from one of the twelve disciples—James. (The source for James' perspective comes from *The Last Week* by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan, New Testament scholars we've encountered in "Saving Jesus" and authors of *The First Paul*.) We will first hear from the apostle James on Ash Wednesday.

You are welcome to join us on our Lenten journey together, each week, all the way to Jerusalem.

What's Up with these "Building a Welcoming Watertown" events?

Since last fall, you may have noticed a series of (mostly) monthly Sunday afternoon events held at the public library called "Building a Welcoming Watertown." (Many of you have even participated in these events!) But in case you're not so sure what that's all about, these sessions have been gatherings of the community, drawn primarily from four area congregations—First Congregational, Immanuel Lutheran, Saint Paul's Episcopal, and Ebenezer Moravian. People from these four congregations began coming together in response to the expressions of Christian nationalism in the Watertown community since at least last July.

Each of these gatherings has been led by a representative of WISDOM—a statewide interfaith justice-oriented organizing network. These meetings have led now to the point of clarifying what this new group's goals will be. Lay leaders from each of the four churches have agreed to undertake outreach efforts to their own congregation to listen to what motivates all of you to seek justice in our community and to discover what you think of how well Watertown welcomes all. We will commission these folks in worship on an upcoming Sunday. If they give you a call to talk, please consider giving them 20-30 minutes of your time to meet in person. They are hoping to hear from you.

If you would like to become involved with "Building a Welcoming Watertown" or would like to know more, please let Pastor Chris know.

Looking at the past year (as I write in almost every letter to you), we have accomplished a lot and have set a stronger foundation for worship and service. Briefly, the main steps forward have been:

- 1. We have a settled pastor.
- 2. We have a new constitution and a new Church Council.
- 3. We have remodeled our classrooms to better serve Gingerbread Preschool and Child Care.
- We are financially stable, though we need to look into how to correct our budget deficit and to invest in our church building to better serve our congregation and community.

With those positive changes in mind, I observe and appreciate our Coffee Fellowship each Sunday. There I can witness our strong small congregation that is thriving together.

Mary's Room is an Outreach Program of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Watertown WI serving the infants and children of Watertown and surrounding communities through God's abundant grace.

Mary's Room is dedicated to fostering the well-being of infants and young children through facilitating the donation, collection, and distribution of furniture, clothing, diapers, and other basic items for children to families while assisting them to achieve economic independence. Mary's Room focuses on families located in Watertown WI, and Jefferson and Dodge Counties.

Mary's Room is open three times a week. During our work hours, we have three volunteers to run Mary's Room. During our open hours, individual families come to Mary's Room to collect diapers, toiletries, formula, clothing, furniture, blankets, toys, books, and much more.

We accept donations of new or clean preowned clothes, toys, books, etc. . See a *Mary's Room* volunteer when dropping off donations.

On average, we currently serve about 80 households and 100 children each month. Our families are low-income parents.
