From the Pastor's Desk

Although Easter Sunday fell on March 31, we spend the entire month of April this year celebrating Easter. The truth is that the 50 days of Easter will last into the third week of May.

We likely won't be hiding Easter eggs over and over again for 50 days, so what does it really mean to celebrate the season of Easter for so long? I think one reason Eastertide might be so long is to help remind us that living the truth of the Risen Christ is not a one-day affair, but a constant calling for Christians. Proclaiming the Risen Christ is something we do every day. We do it whenever we continue to love our neighbors. We do it whenever we welcome others. We do it whenever we seek peace. We do it whenever we share goods. We do it whenever we work for a more just society. Every time we do any of these things, we witness to the truth that Christ livesthat empires of violence, oppression, conquest, hatred, and suffering cannot keep Christ in the grave. The Body of Christ still lives, because we are the members of that Body, and we continue Christ's work.

This month offers several opportunities to do exactly this kind of work. Sunday afternoon, April 14 brings our next **"Building a Welcoming Watertown"** event at the public library with folks from three other area churches. We will observe Earth Sunday on April 21, remembering our call to honor and preserve God's creation. The Annual Meeting of the Southeast Wisconsin Association is scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 27 in Oconomowoc, affording an opportunity to live out our identity as the Body of Christ in our closest denominational setting. And on April 28, we will acknowledge Camp Sunday in worship, reflecting on how outdoor ministries help us to encounter God as individuals and in community.

Eastertide is a great time to keep up with what's happening at First Congregational UCC. You don't want to miss out!
