

From the Pastor's Desk



With Lent, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday behind us, sometimes we might wonder what we're supposed to be doing as the Church during the "50 great days of Eastertide." As the scripture stories from the lectionary suggest during this season, we

are called—like the early disciples—to serve as witnesses to the Resurrection.

That may sound intimidating. It doesn't necessarily mean that we have literally seen the Risen Jesus, but it does mean we witness to our *experience* of a Risen Christ.

Sometimes when we hear the word "witness" in a religious context, we might assume it means something along the lines of proselytism—of trying to convince others to believe similar things to what we believe.

Neither do I think that's what it means to serve as a witness to the Resurrection. Rather, I think the act of witnessing has to do with telling what we do know—that God is a God of goodness and love, that God seeks liberation of all, that God brings forth new life and hope, and that we find God especially present in community.

And here's one more thing about being a witness in this sense—telling what we experience doesn't have to be with our words, but involves our deeds, too. We serve as witnesses to the Resurrection when we show our values in our

real-world everyday life, values that stem from our trust in these truths about God.

So let us indeed continue to serve as witnesses to Christ's Resurrection and to the good news of what God does in the world—by showing the world what good God does through us. And let us offer this witness not just during Eastertide, but in every season.

Tartan Day Revisit Choir Anthem-Hymn of Unity

MacPherson's fiddle tune was written by infamous James MacPherson (1675-1700), a freebooter (pirate) and fiddle player in the hours before his death. Later, poet Robert Burns, among several others, set lyrics to the tune, as did John Haynes Holmes, the lyricist of the Hymn of Unity.

Holmes (1879-1964) was a Unitarian minister, a pacificist, co-founder of NAACP and the ACLU. He is noted for his anti-war activism. This choir anthem was arranged by Raymond H. Haan.

O God of all, whose spirit moves
From pole to silent pole
Whose purpose binds the starry spheres
In one stupendous whole,
Whose life, like light,
was freely poured
On all beneath the sun
To you we lift our hearts and pray
That you will make us one.

And the Strengthen the Church offering makes this revitalizing work possible.










UCC Summer Camps Don't miss out!
