I am planning a community event at Salem UCC, Verona, to raise awareness for the experiences of immigrants and refugees in our nation and local community. I have partnered with an organization called Family Diversity Projects to host their photo and text exhibit titled "Building Bridges: Portraits of Immigrants and Refugees." Our church will host the exhibit for three weeks and it will be free and open to the public. Although our church is sponsoring this event, we intend the exhibit to be an informational event for the entire community regardless of religious affiliation.

To launch the opening of the exhibit, we are hosting an evening reception event on January 12 from 6:30-9:00pm at Salem UCC in Verona. As part of this exhibit opening, members of Plymouth UCC, Madison, will present their mission immersion experiences at the U.S./Mexico border. Other local organizations who support immigrants and refugees will join us on Jan. 12 to share their mission and work. I want to connect the community with these organizations to provide them opportunities to become involved.

I am contacting all of the UCC churches in the Southwest and Southeast Associations of the Wisconsin Conference to invite your congregation to join us on Jan. 12 for the exhibit opening, reception, and border presentation. The exhibit will remain at Salem UCC from January 13 through February 6 and can be viewed by individuals and groups during open hours (see flyer) or by appointment.

Youth and youth groups are invited to attend the program on January 12. Our youth group will also be gathering at the exhibit on Feb. 2, 4-5:30pm, to engage in a special program and conversation regarding immigration. We invite your youth to join us! A Word About the Prelude...

From Sunday, January 5, 2020: an introduction to prelude was shared........

"I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day" is a Christmas carol based on a poem written by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow on Christmas Day, 1864. The song tells of the narrator's despair over personal tragedies, and the American Civil War.

In spite of the mention of bells and Christmas in the title, "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day" is as much an anti-war song as it is a pro-Christmas song. The carol concludes with bells carrying renewed hope for peace on earth.


