

Latest update from the Reopening Committee and Council


<u>Effective immediately</u> reservations will no longer be required to attend services. We have plenty of space to accommodate our summer attendees and still maintain proper social distancing.

Also, effective immediately, per the CDC guidelines, the wearing of masks to services will be **optional for fully vaccinated** attendees, but masks are **recommended (and requested) for all unvaccinated participants**.

Further, we request that all congregants that want to participate in choral pieces, except for the choral leader in front of the sanctuary, wear a mask while singing. Vaccinated participants are free to remove their masks after singing but are requested to mask prior to singing. (see Juanita's related article on page 2)

We plan to begin with an outdoor Fellowship after the Sunday, July 11th service. This is also the service where we will celebrate the 176th anniversary of the founding of our church.

We plan to voluntarily survey Sunday service attendants as to whether they are vaccinated. This information will be used to determine further modifications to our reopening policy. This will be a simple Yes or No checkbox that is to be anonymously left in the offering plates as you either enter or exit the Sanctuary.

From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Church Family, Yesterday, Sunday, June 27 was Open and Affirming Sunday in the United Church of Christ. Despite the fact that being an ONA faith community here at

First Congregational has such a faithful, devoted, inclusive, welcoming, and affirming history I believe that there may be some church members who do not know what Open and Affirming really means. We all are living the meaning of this designation in such a way that we assume that we do not need the title anymore.

Not true. YES, we are living out our faith here at First Congregational that welcomes ALL people, but still there are many in our community who do not understand. There are even so-called Christians who seek to use our faith as a weapon against Lesbians, Gays, Bi-Sexual, Transgender and Queer sisters and brothers, mothers and fathers and daughters and sons. (LGBTQ)

That is why we need to intentionally take the time to again lift up, name, proclaim, love, and celebrate God's love and blessing and welcome and care for ALL.

The testimonies of these ministries proclaim the truth of God's power to transform cultures of hate and violence into communities of healing and reconciliation. They give witness to God's continuing testament and how the gifts of God are being liberated for service to the world and in the world.

Our congregation became one of those ONA congregations on July 13, 2014. It was a difficult process that required a lot of listening, praying, learning, and risking. In the end, a large majority of our congregation joyfully affirmed that we

are Open to all and Affirming of all of God's children. This means we joyfully and faithfully welcome LGBT people into the full life and leadership of our community.

In the years since we have joined in the struggle for civil rights, blessed many couples, celebrated the 2015 ruling for same-sex marriage rights. We continue to work for the full inclusion of people regardless of sexual orientation and gender expression.

I hope and pray that you understand the meaning of ONA and affirm that this is the church that we were created to be, and this is the discipleship that Jesus challenges us to fulfill. "Jesus doesn't reject anyone; neither do we."

Notes from the Music Director

These musicians contributed during the month of June: Susie Krueger, Jennie Ortega, and myself. Thank you for willingly sharing your gifts of time and talent.

We are seeking your offering of musical gifts for our worship. As we have been sharing inperson worship, it is now suggested to have congregational singing only when masked and appropriate distance between family groups. We need to remember that while many may be vaccinated in our congregation, there are those who are not yet eligible to receive vaccines, or cannot, for various reasons.

** Please note, <u>one</u> of the sources that was used in this decision comes at the end of my column. For our second month of in-person services, we are moving to the less restrictive guideline highlighted in yellow. This is well within the

common practice for churches of members in the United Church of Christ Musicians Association, although many are still not having congregational singing.

We would like to continue the practice of sharing music in a safe way to enrich our worship. The plan includes a solo vocalist leading the hymns for the day at a safe distance, unmasked and with a microphone for clarity.

Would you be interested in leading the hymns during worship on a Sunday? Would you be interested in sharing a musical offering (now that technology isn't a problem?) I am looking for some interested musicians for these parts of worship. The musical offering can be vocal or instrumental.

** THE HYMN SOCIETY'S RECOMMENDATION: WE DO NOT CURRENTLY RECOMMEND THAT CONGREGATIONS SING.

- 1. The CDC still indicates that for unvaccinated people gathering and singing together is a high risk activity.
- 2. 27,000 new cases are still being reported daily in the U.S.
- Worship services are by their very nature public events which include a number of variables that, depending on how each variable plays out, can quickly change the risk-factors involved in a gathering.
- 4. The new recommendations for unmasking only apply to those who are fully vaccinated, which still makes up far less than 50% of the total U.S. population.
- The CDC guidelines for <u>Communities of Faith</u>
 <u>CDC</u> have not changed or been updated since February 19th, 2021.

For any public group that does sing, wearing a mask will reduce the risk of spreading infection.
