From the Pastor's Desk:

"Love never gives up. Love cares more for others than for self. Love doesn't want what it doesn't have. Love doesn't strut, doesn't have a swelled head, doesn't force itself on others, isn't always 'me first,' doesn't fly off the handle, doesn't

keep score of the sins of others, doesn't revel when others grovel, takes pleasure in the flowering of truth, puts up with anything, trusts God always, always looks for the best, never looks back, but keeps going to the end."

-1 Corinthians 13: 4-7 (The Message)

- After the love-filled Sunday worship that we shared yesterday in which Jim and James Ortega and Susie Krueger offered "You Raise Me Up" as a musical offering, I was reminded of a Chimes article that I shared more than 5 years ago. What follows is that article (with several updates and edits)
- I have a friend who served as custodian in another church, who once admitted that when all of us started e-mailing and texting and then tweeting or using any other electronic communication or social media, she didn't know what people meant when they used "LOL" in their message.
- Many people use these three letters to communicate "Laugh Out Loud". My friend, however, interpreted "LOL" as **"Lots Of Love".** From what she told me, this mistake continued for several years, and it was a source of laughter in her family who did not tell her that her interpretation was different from everyone else.
- She used "LOL" to convey support, compassion, caring, understanding, and affection to her friends and neighbors. Well, I have to tell you that I have come to believe that she was correct all along. And I believe Scripture supports me.

- Here in our congregation, there has been "Lots Of Love" for 176 years and especially in the last 2 years when the COVID pandemic required us to find different ways to stay connected and to share support in different, but still very loving ways. LOL.
- Juanita Edington, our choir director, became our video guru who put together a virtual Service of Worship every Sunday. The hours spent in learning new skills, editing, and sharing our worship with the Watertown television station and on Facebook and with Marquart Village and the church website and to every church member through email. LOL.
- Melissa Mattke, our director of Children and Youth ministries has invested untold energy and countless hours to ensure that our Sunday School is not only a safe place for our children, but also a loving home. From September to June, the Sunday School and the Youth Group met weekly via Zoom. The families who were involved found the programs to be uplifting, safe, and loving. LOL.
- And now we are able to worship together safely because we follow necessary protocols to keep everyone safe from COVID. It isn't perfect yet, but it is an important step forward. We are here with and for each other. LOL
- And how wonderful our worship is. As Jim, James and Susie reminded us when they shared "You Raise Me Up" by Josh Groban: "When I am down and oh my soul so weary. When troubles come and my heart burdened be. Then I am still and wait here in the silence. Until you come and sit a while with me. You raise me up, so I can stand on mountains. You raise me up, to walk on stormy seas." Now that is who we are as a church. That represents **Lots of Love**!

These musicians contributed during the month of June: Susie Krueger, Jennie, Jim, and James Ortega, and myself. Thank you for willingly sharing your gifts of time and talent.

- We are seeking your offering of musical gifts for our worship. As we have been sharing in-person worship, it continues to be recommended to have congregational singing only when masked and appropriate distance between family groups. We need to remember that while many may be vaccinated in our congregation, there are those who are not yet eligible to receive vaccines, or cannot, for various reasons. **Please note, one of the sources that was used in this decision comes at the end of my column. For our third month of in-person services, we are maintaining the guideline highlighted in yellow. This is well within the common practice for churches of members in the United Church of Christ Musicians Assoc., although many are still not having congregational singing. Unfortunately, cases are again on the rise, both nationally and in Wisconsin.
- We would like to continue the practice of sharing music in a safe way to enrich our worship. The plan includes a solo vocalist leading the hymns for the day at a safe distance, unmasked and with a microphone for clarity for the in-person congregation and the congregation attending online.
- Would you be interested in *leading the hymns during worship* on a Sunday? Would you be interested in *sharing a musical offering* (now that technology isn't a problem?) I am looking for some interested musicians for these parts of worship. The musical offering can be vocal or instrumental. -Please contact me if you would be interested.

- ** THE HYMN SOCIETY'S RECOMMENDATION: WE DO NOT CURRENTLY RECOMMEND THAT CONGREGATIONS SING.
- 1. The CDC still indicates that for unvaccinated people gathering and singing together is a high risk activity.
- 2. 27,000 new cases are still being reported daily in the U.S.
- Worship services are by their very nature public events which include a number of variables that, depending on how each variable plays out, can quickly change the riskfactors involved in a gathering.
- 4. The new recommendations for unmasking only apply to those who are fully vaccinated, which still makes up far less than 50% of the total U.S. population.
- 5. The CDC guidelines for <u>Communities of Faith</u> <u>CDC</u> have not changed or been updated since February 19th, 2021.

For any public group that does sing, wearing a mask will reduce the risk of spreading infection.

Reopening Committee and Council Update

- The test run of offering an outdoor Fellowship went very well after our 176th anniversary celebration on July 11th. In August we plan to offer outdoor Fellowship the first and third Sunday of the month weather permitting.
- We've also agreed that unvaccinated children may come forward for Family Time if they wish as long as they are wearing a mask. Children will be socially distanced from each other at the front of the congregation.
- The balance of the covid safe management policies for August's services remain the same as followed in July: participants that are fully vaccinated are free to choose if they want to wear a mask; those who have not been vaccinated are requested to wear a mask, and everyone is encouraged to wear a mask while singing.
- As stated last month, reservations are not necessary as we have plenty of room to socially distance in our sanctuary.
