From the Pastor's Desk



With Ash Wednesday on March 5, this month brings the season of Lent. As last year, in addition to worship on Ash Wednesday, we will offer midweek Lenten services for the next five Wednesdays at 7 p.m.

In the Wednesday evening services following Ash Wednesday, we'll be taking a look at a particular thread throughout Christian history: creeds. In 2025, we live in a time in which the most powerful Christian voices seek a Christian unity not rooted in respect of diversity, but in uniformity. Additionally, these same voices are not shy about using the levers of government to pursue their agenda.

Such a situation is not new to Christianity. As we'll see, the formulation of creeds often related to imposing a uniformity over and against diversity of thought; and at a very early point, the creeds also became tools of the government to enforce official versions of the faith.

But each creed arose out of specific historical circumstances, and each one was developed with a purpose in the minds of those who composed it.

Come and worship with us on Wednesday nights and learn more about how Christianity has attempted to balance a drive for institutional unity in the face of more diverse modes of faith and thought than we likely realize.

On Sunday, March 30 at 6:30 p.m., we will hear from Rabbi Bonnie Margulis who is also connected to many justice causes, but may be offering a different perspective on the history and ongoing conflict in the region.

High school age and above are welcome.

Looking Deeper into the Music

During Black History Month, I had selected three anthems from the Justice Choir Songbook, which is a resource for music of the social justice movement, old and new. I encountered a couple of divergent readings that reinforce the idea of power of singing and community song.

One of those readings was shared by Pastor Chris from Christian Century and I will share the link here:

https://www.christiancentury.org/voices/i-still-havevoice As you read this piece, I think you can just as easily substitute the word congregation in place of choir and still make a connection to the power of joining voices together.

The second is actually more extensive, from the book "The Last House on the Street" a mystery that unfolds in 2010, but depends on extensive flashbacks to 1965. In 1965, a young North Carolinian white woman chooses to spend the summer volunteering to educate and enroll black voters with the group S.C.O.P.E. (Summer Community Organization and Political Education Project.) As part of their training, they participated in daily community singing of songs such as "I'll Fly Away," "We Shall Overcome," "This Little Light of Mine," "Eyes on the Prize," and more.

These songs helped to build community and strength amongst the trainees and later served to build bridges between the white students and the African American people they were hoping to prepare to register to vote. The songs were not entertainment, but builders of confidence, of solidarity, of familiarity, of faith.
