#### From the Pastor's Desk

We arrive at the most important events of the Christian liturgical year this month—Holy Week: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and of course, Easter Sunday.

But before all that, there's another special Sunday in April. One of the things we may not spend too much time thinking about is that when our congregation was founded, most of its members were Presbyterian. In the 19th century, Presbyterians and Congregationalists shared missionary outreach. Often, these missionaries alternated between which denominational affiliation would be used with each new church plant—one town Congregationalist, perhaps, the next Presbyterian.

That means that our congregation's heritage includes
Presbyterian roots, and the Presbyterians are
denominational descendants of the Church of
Scotland. So, although you may not have realized it,
our congregation's founders are connected to Scottish
history. (Coincidentally, so is my family name.)

To celebrate this Scottish connection, we're planning a Scottish-themed worship service on Sunday, April 6, known as Tartan Day.

What's Tartan Day? Well, you'll have to come to find out (kilts and other tartan-themed attire are welcome).

But the day was originally connected to the Easter celebration, believe it or not. And so, on the following Sunday—April 12—we'll be observing Palm Sunday and begin our remembrance of the events of Holy Week.

Like last year, we will offer a Tenebrae service with Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday (April 13, 7 p.m.) and a 3 p.m. worship service on Good Friday.

And early on Easter Sunday, we will again be holding a Sunrise Service—this year at *6 a.m.*And this service—weather permitting—will be outside in the area around the gazebo. We will have our regular 10 a.m. worship in the sanctuary with Holy Communion as well, and in between there will be a light Easter breakfast.

This month brings a lot of opportunities for different kinds of worship—we'd love to see you at all of these events!
